Topic: Adverbs

Adverbs: *An adverb is a word that tells something more about a verb. It tells how, where or when an action happens.*

*E.g.: * I ate my dinner quickly.*

In this sentence 'quickly' describes how the action word 'ate'.

**Sam sees many puppies outside.*

Here the word 'outside' tells us where the action happens.

**My father came home early.*

Here the word 'early' tells us when the action happens.

Note: *Many adverbs are formed by adding -ly at the end of the adjective.*
