- We use or to join the pairs of sentences '**or**' is used to show choice.

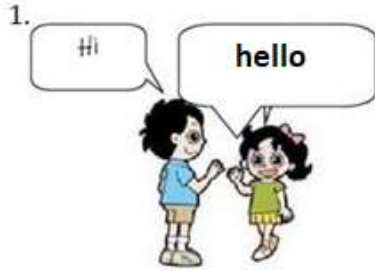
