Adjectives: Words that describe or modify a noun or a pronoun are called adjectives.

Demonstrative Adjectives: A demonstrative adjective points out some person or thing.

Ex: This, that, those, these, such & certain

◆ Demonstrative adjectives answer the question “Which one? “

Ex 1. **These** bikes are not parked properly.

Here, in this example, **these** is the Demonstrative Adjective as it points out to **bikes**.

Possessive Adjectives : Adjectives that show the possession or the belongingness of the noun are called a possessive adjectives.

Possessive Adjectives

	Singular	Plural
First Person	My	Our
Second Person	Your	Your
Third Person	His, Her, Its	Their

Ex: **His** pen is on the table.

In this example, **His** is the possessive adjective as it tells about the belongingness of the **pen**.

Interrogative Adjectives: An interrogative adjective is used before a noun to ask questions.

Ex: Whose, What, Which ...

Ex: **What** does COVID-19 stand for?

Here, in this example **what** is the Interrogative adjective .
